I am overwhelmed at God's amazing grace and mercy! That He would allow me the opportunity to serve the women and families of St Andrew's Church and be a part of such a dedicated and loving team is a blessing beyond description.

I became a Christian shortly after marrying my husband, Mike, just over 20 years ago. Late one night, after watching a "Jesus" movie (Mike was trying very hard to win me to Christ... had many people praying for me....I wasn't having any of it!), I remembered my friends and I playing around when we were about 13 and having a séance. Christ's death and resurrection reconciling me to God. I was truly born again. I knew it and I felt it! Like 2+2=4, I couldn't un-know it.

Mike and I are proud parents of a beautiful 7-year-old daughter, Ashley. Our deepest prayer is that God would help us tenderly teach her His ways in the hope that she too will one day know the remarkable love of Christ. This is not always easy and we make a lot of mistakes, but God is gracious and merciful as we are reminded her salvation is not in our hands.

Having been a Christian for just over 20 years, I am still awestruck at the power of Jesus Christ through His Church to embrace, encourage, edify, teach, pray for, share, pastor and love one another in Him. I pray I can touch the lives of as many women as have touched mine.

Book Review

Gospel Centred Family

By Ed Moll and Tim Chester



A "Gospel-Centred Family" by Ed Moll and Tim Chester is a well-defined, concise and practical study guide for Christian parenting. Its layout is simple and succinct. Each chapter begins with a clearly stated key principle, followed by a scenario, appropriate accompanying Bible verse, questions that encourage reflection and some ideas to put it all into practice.

I long for my daughter's salvation! How ironic then, I realized after reading this book, that I am tempted to turn her into an idol. By making her the centre of our world, my husband and I teach her nothing of the true liberating freedom of being under God's gracious authority or about how to serve others. Instead, she has learned that Mummy and Daddy's world pretty much revolves around her.

As I read on, it became clear that there were so many parenting issues I needed to understand in light of the Gospel. Does my daughter know where our treasure is? Does she understand that I care more about changing her heart than her behaviour when I discipline? Or do my often muddled, selfish and inconsistent motives cloud the issue? Is my discipline an act of love or retaliation?

"Trying to be a good parent will crush you if you don't embrace grace" (chapter 4). I was reminded, that I am not responsible for my daughters salvation, she is. The reader will uncover a multitude of gems in this little book, but chapter 12 really drives it all home: we are called to love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength and to love our neighbour as ourselves. If we live this out, we can't help but impact those around us: in our home, our church, our community, and the world.

"Gospel-Centred Family" is an inspiring read that will dare you to re-think the way you approach parenting and life. I recommend it to anyone up for the challenge!

After completing high school I joined Youth With A Mission (YWAM), where I received my training in Biblical studies, evangelism, leadership training and discipleship. There I was involved with training in the Biblical Studies department and ran the base's household operations while I served as a Sunday school teacher.

We all have dreams and a call on our lives to serve Jesus with our gifts and talents. 5-Minute Conversation with Mei Mei Yip (long-term church member, mother of four) I was asked to write about how touching my experiences have been in watching each of my children go through St Andrew's Church crèche and then see them immediately turn into little evangelistic angels, singing their favorite worship

First, some background information, we are a family with four young children, oldest 8 years and youngest 2 years. We are relatively new Christians from a non-believing background. I can definitely say that this past year has been a real struggle trying to parent these children (2 are in primary school, so you can imagine the workload!) and to be Christian parents at the same time. Daily, I have doubted my Christian parenting and ask for forgiveness for my weaknesses. Shouting matches are a regular occurrence in our household, my lack of self-control leads to poorly phrased comments and very often night time prayers are rushed. How on earth was I showing them through my actions how amazing God is.

I wasn't sure how to write it, then tonight God gave me something else to write

However, tonight in a 5 minute conversation while cleaning my 7-year-old son's ears (yep cleaning his ears) was a sign from God that despite all I must be doing something right. Out of the blue, my son just innocently looked at me and told me "Mummy I love God more than you, but you come second". Wow, that knocked me and I was so happy. He got it. I told him he was right and that that was God's first rule. We carried on this discussion briefly about how much God loves us because he gave us to each other. The next mind-blowing comment was that God must have given me 4 children to teach me about patience. Hmmm, he really nailed that one. I had to agree on that one and explained yes God does go around things in a strange way. He doesn't necessarily answer our prayers the way we want, trying to use the example of David and Goliath. I told that I bet a lot of the prayers from the Israelites were hoping for God to send them an equally large giant to fight Goliath. The little genius agreed and said they had forgotten about God and he decided to send them David to teach them that size didn't matter, only trust in God is important. That was my 5-minute conversation with the son who has been giving me the most headaches in the last 4 months. It had been an ordinary day he hadn't had an amazing fun day or gotten a present that he really wanted that we used as a way to show him how great, giving and loving God is. It was just an ordinary day.



So when I have my doubts about whether St Andrew's Family and Children ministries or I am having any influence on him I will think back to this 5-minute conversation.
