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

Family Ministry

Children were running around everywhere, laughing, yelling and chasing each other. It was noisy and disordered; pizza was being devoured while toy cars and motorbikes were being driven. Parents were caught up in conversation, while at the same time doing their best to care for children that were asking to be pushed on the swing or helped down the slide.

At first glance this scene looked like chaos, but in reality it was evidence of a healthy and vibrant church community. It was the scene from a recent Family Ministry lunch in the



playground after church. Many churches throughout the world are in decline and are void of young families, youth and children. However, St Andrew's is not such a church. The fact that we have so many young people in our church and joining our church is a clear sign of the fact that we are a growing and flourishing church.



Currently we have around from 320 families registered for our Sunday youth and children's programmes. This doesn't include the many families that come through our door each week and don't get around to registering their youth and children with us. Our Sunday Kidzone is constantly increasing in numbers and we have a large team of volunteers that teach hundreds of children. We also have about 120 youth registered in our youth programme. Darren and his leaders run an excellent Sunday worship with a fantastic youth band and on Fridays they run an after school programmes called Ignite.

As a result, St Andrew's Church has gained a reputation for its quality youth and children's programmes. People are continually migrating to St Andrew's Church because they want their families to grow spiritually and their youth and children to be well catered for.

We have also been able to offer internships to a number of youths...

With our 2020 Vision we want to capitalise on this reputation and use it as a launch pad into the lives of the families in our community. In Family Ministry we are convinced that this is the provision of a God-given doorway for us as a church to reach deeper into our local community. As a result we pray that the 2020 Vision will draw more people into his kingdom and into a relationship with Jesus. We are also keen to see the new Life Centre built so that as we continue to grow in numbers we will have the facilities to accommodate these many young families that God is bringing to us.

Another exciting aspect of our 2020 Vision has been the increase in size of our Family Ministry Team with the exciting additions of Carol Strydom (Children's Ministry Director) and Lisa Card (Women's Pastoral Worker). We have also been able to offer internships to a number of youths who have either come back to Hong Kong for their summer vacation, or are about to go to university. They have been a great help in our Kidzone, Youth, Music and Creative ministries.

Our team has already been active in many areas including the running of Marriage and Parenting courses, Kidzone and Youth, marriage preparation and weddings, as well as Growth Groups, pastoral care and family social activities. In addition to this, God continues to provide even more doorways into the community with additional school visits, a closer partnership Interns: with DGS & DGJS, possible expansion of our playgroup and the start of a weekly Kid's Club. This is the 2020 Vision being Dora Chu & Emma To put into action!



Fortunately our Marriage Mentors introduced us to the book The Five Love Languages. We learned that there are five ways to express (and receive) love - physical touch (eg. hugs and kisses), quality time (one on one time, i-Phones set aside), words of affirmation (eg. honey, well done!), acts of service (eg. doing things for one another) and giving each other gifts. We learned that everyone has a primary love language (ie. one that the person feels most loved by when love is expressed in that form) and that we have to express our love to our spouse in his or her primary love language for our spouse to truly feel our love.

Attending the Newlywed Game helped us re-focus on the "we" again. We look forward to more such events!

The Meaning of Marriage

My greatest impression of the book is that it elevates marriage, making it something beautiful and holy and lovely.

A marriage is one of the most intimate, joyous, and yet potentially damaging relationships any person can experience. Given its complexity, it's important that we keep thinking, reflecting and working on our marriages, seeking to understand God's intention for them.

With his wife Kathy, Tim Keller (author and pastor of Redeemer Presbyterian Church in New York City) has written 'The Meaning of Marriage'. Quite simply, it is the best book on marriage I have read. Whilst immensely practical, the major strength of the book is its gospel-centredness. It invites the reader deep into the gospel of Jesus Christ and shows how it extends to every part of marriage. The book is comprised of eight chapters that flow logically from the biblical basis for marriage all the way to the sexual relationship within marriage.

The Kellers speak from the powerful combination of Scriptural grounding and real-world experience. They have been married for almost four decades, and like us have sought to raise their children in the challenging surrounds of a highly urbanized setting.

My greatest impression of the book is that it elevates marriage, making it something beautiful and holy and lovely. And with it comes friendship and companionship and sex and everything else God has packaged into the marriage relationship. I cannot commend it highly enough. Look out for it in the coming few months on the church bookstall.
